Dear Chief,

On October 24, 2016 at or about pm I spoke with Sergeant Jack Montesanto in my office regarding the Personnel Complaint from [REDACTED] claimed Sergeant Montesanto stated that [REDACTED] never worked and the bail money he had was probably stolen. Lt. Heieck conducted an internal investigation and determined that the alleged complaint against Sergeant Montesanto was substantial.

During my conversation, Sergeant Jack Montesanto did state that he did claim that [REDACTED] never had a job and that he steals from his father.

I advised Sergeant Montesanto of General Orders Section 305 III (25) – Rules of Conduct (Courtesy) where officers “shall control their tempers and exercise the utmost patience and discretion, and shall not engage in argumentative discussions even in the face of extreme provocation.” & “officers shall not use insolent language”.

Sergeant Montesanto agreed that he should have not made those comments to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Sergeant Montesanto apologized and stated that actions like this would not happen again.
